**LAF** Title IX continues to be a prime area of focus and Missouri Branches have conducted seminars and programs to share information with the public as well as their membership to promote awareness of this federally mandated provision. AAUW LAF has continued to show a strong commitment to equity, as evidenced by their support of one of the key equity cases of recent years, *Wal-Mart v. Dukes*, which is currently at the U.S. Supreme Court awaiting a decision on the issue of class action. Although it is more likely that the Court will rule in favor of *Wal-Mart*, support of this case shows the determination of AAUW to pursue the issue of equity for women and girls not only in the area of education, but in the workplace as well.

## **HISTORY REPORT**

**Since assuming position as History Officer, I have communicated with branch presidents through articles in Missouri in Motion and through personal e-mails describing branch records needed for the AAUW Archives. So far only three branches have submitted material, Columbia, Ferguson-Florissant, and Independence. I will collect relevant reports and records from State Board meetings and have those from at least couple of years. Future plans are to continue reaching out to branch presidents or to history chairs when they are named in order to get more branch support.**

**An update of the AAUW Missouri history 1996-2010 is complete including the integration of material from 1976. Copies will be available at the April 29-May 1, 2011, Conference at Tan-Tar-A for attendees to view and discuss. Columbia Branch members (in alphabetical order) Dr. Jane Biers, Holly Burgess, and Dr. Alice Reese worked tirelessly for many, many hours, using their highly skilled abilities to complete this huge project. As History Officer on Board, I researched, collected materials, and nagged branches to submit their histories. Unfortunately, of the 23 existing branches, six did not respond but Lebanon that has now disbanded, did send a short report.**

**Plan for Disbursement to Branch officers, Board officers, and other AAUW members: Copy the History Update as ordered for a cost it is hoped to be no more than \$15. Details of that are being worked out. I, as History Officer, will be in charge of marketing, copying, and disbursing. Board Action: To discuss and take action on above proposal.**

Public Policy Year End Report

AAUW Public Policy in Missouri was busy this year thanks to the work of the members of our Public Policy Committee, board members, branch members and President Julia Triplett.

We submitted an AAUW Public Policy Impact Grant and received \$1000.00 Huge thanks to Shirley Breeze for pulling it together and writing our grant for us in record time. After receiving the grant our Public Policy Committee met in Columbia, MO to discuss how to implement the principals of the grant.

The purpose was to implement policy activities throughout the state and create voter guides for the November elections. We found it difficult to produce our own guides specific to candidates but came up with a terrific guide based on the principals of AAUW titled “ Before you Vote, Ask yourself what the Candidate Thinks About” listing such things as using tax dollars for private schools; reproductive rights; wage equity and more. This guide will be useful for all elections and can be updated as we vote on Public Policy Programs at each National Convention. Terri Miller also produced a great guide on how to be a political “lobbyist” at whatever level you are comfortable with. Throughout the year Public Policy Co-Chair Elizabeth Hendrix and President Julia Triplett have been participating in Impact Grant Conference calls to discuss ways to use Impact Grant funds for Public Policy Programs.

Public Policy has also tried to stay abreast of what National has to offer in the form of programs, AAUW webinars, AAUW conference calls, and conference calls with the White House. Holly Burgess, and other branch members, participated in a Webinar on In-District Advocacy Visits with Grassroots Advocacy Coordinator, Sam Lehman. Elizabeth Hendrix and Sandy Camillo have participated in Voices Project, a program designed to help AAUW members become skilled and savvy about submitting written information (i.e. op-ed pieces on AAUW issues.) Elizabeth Hendrix’s editorial on pay equity was printed in the St. Joseph newspaper on Equity Day.

Several AAUW members attended the Women’s Legislative Retreat in Jefferson City in January coordinated by Women’s Women’s Network and then followed up with Lobby Day in Jefferson City.

Holly Burgess testified at her first committee hearing in favor of Representative Stacey Newman’s bill promoting Equal Employment Practice. We hope that many more AAUW members will continue to speak out on AAUW priorities.

Public Policy has worked hard at making sure all branches are included in the public policy process. Elizabeth Hendrix sent out an application to each branch to apply for public policy grant money to fund a program in their community. Holly Burgess sent out a public policy survey to assess what is important to the AAUW members of our state. The surveys have been returned (58) and we will share the results with the State Board and the membership. Unfortunately to date, no Branch has applied for AAUW funds.
