AAUW Advocacy: Guided by our member-endorsed Public Policy Program, AAUW's local, state, national, and global lobbying and grassroots efforts help empower women and girls.

AAUW National Convention: Our biennial meeting empowers women leaders to learn new skills, gain insight and inspiration, and connect with other women leaders.

Campus Action Project (CAP) Grants: CAP grants focused on AAUW research help campus women empower other students through projects designed to end the barriers women still face.

Campus Outreach Grants: These grants provide funding for AAUW members to host events educating students about unfair pay, sexual harassment and assault, pregnancy discrimination, and Title IX violations.

College/University (C/U) Partners: C/U membership opens doors to AAUW grants and fellowships, leadership training, professional development, and advocacy tools.

Eleanor Roosevelt Fund: The Eleanor Roosevelt Fund supports research on gender equity in education and the workplace.

Elect Her—Campus Women Win: Elect Her is the only national program encouraging and training college women to run for student government and future political office.

Fellows Alumnae Initiative: This initiative connects former AAUW fellows and grantees with one another and with AAUW.

Legal Advocacy Fund (LAF): LAF challenges sex discrimination in higher education and the workplace.

LAF Case Support Travel Grants: These grants pay the travel expenses of AAUW-supported plaintiffs and their lawyers who are speaking at state conventions or regional meetings.

Legal Case Support: These awards support cases in the workplace and academia that have the potential to protect all women.

Member Leader Programs: The programs include formal leadership training, resources, and opportunities for members at the branch, state, and national levels.

National Conference for College Women Student Leaders (NCCWSL): America's premier annual conference for college women prepares attendees to be campus and community leaders.

National Student Advisory Council: These AAUW ambassadors advise staff about college students' needs, lead on-campus gender equality projects, and help plan NCCWSL

New Program Development: Elect Her, \$tart \$mart, TechTrek, and others; new programs empower women and girls at the branch, state, and national levels.

Outlook: Our AAUW magazine covers the issues that women face today, from the gender pay gap to human trafficking.

Regional Field Representatives: This pilot program assists nine states with membership recruitment and retention, fundraising, and advocacy.

\$tart \$mart: These workshops prepare college women to enter the job market with the confidence, knowledge, and skills they need to negotiate salaries and benefits.

Tech Savvy: These daylong conferences seek to interest girls in grades 6–9 in STEM fields and inform their families about STEM education and careers.

Tech Trek: Our weeklong camps are designed to encourage girls in STEM in high school, college, and beyond.

Younger Women’s Task Force: This AAUW-affiliate identity is geared toward younger women fighting for social justice.

THE NEW AAUW FUND DIAGRAM

AAUW Fund is the general fund of the organization and contains the pool of money that supplies all or part of the funding for every AAUW program and activity except Fellowships and Grants which are entirely funded from interest from the endowments.

Unrestricted giving to the AAUW Fund keeps AAUW responsive to the issues affecting women today in the areas of greatest need – and those of greatest opportunity – whenever and wherever they occur.

Every program except Fellowships and Grants receives full or partial funding from the Fund which derives primarily from unrestricted contributions with only a small amount coming from dues and sponsorships.

All donations to the Fund are tax deductible. You may still designate a contribution to a favorite program if desired.
