February Speaker: Don Croizer The League was officially founded February 14, 1920, just six months before the 19th amendment was ratified and women won the vote. Formed by the suffragists of the National American Woman Suffrage Association, the League began as a "mighty political experiment" designed to help 20 million women carry out their new responsibilities as voters.

The League of Women Voters is a nonpartisan political organization that encourages the informed and active participation in government, works to increase understanding of major public policy issues, and influences public policy through education and advocacy.

The Lilly Ledbetter Fair Pay Act. signed by President Obama on January 29, 2009, restored the ability of individuals to assert their rights under federal anti-discrimination laws, after a devastating 11th Circuit Court decision that was upheld by the Supreme Court, in *Ledbetter v. Goodyear Tire & Rubber Co.* The Fair Pay Act was monumental in bringing national attention to the issue of pay discrimination, but wages for women have barely improved in the last 15 years. Women of color fare even worse than white women compared to their non-Hispanic white male counterparts.

We honor Lilly Ledbetter and her enduring fight for equal pay and opportunities by marking equal pay days throughout the year - the date at which women in a particular demographic group have to work into *the following year* to approximate the earnings of their white male counterparts from just the year prior.
