<u>AAUW St. Charles Presents 2024 Local Scholarships</u> AAUW St. Charles Branch was chartered in October of 1933 and has awarded scholarships to high school senior women since 1938. Applications which meet the qualifications were accepted from any public or private high school in St. Charles County. The committee reviewed over 40 applications and selected two recipients who attended the May AAUW Branch meeting. Committee chair Rose Ann Weeks presented the scholarship awards to senior Kate Baranoski from Francis Howell Central High School and senior Claire Gwak from Fort Zumwalt East High School. <u>Vote on Education Requirement Change</u>. 66.6% of membership voting yes was needed to drop the college requirement. The final vote was 65.1%, just short of the 2/3 majority needed. The biggest ramification of not passing includes lesser chance of grants and sponsorships from corporations who evaluate upon the words 'inclusive' and 'diversity' in AAUW statements.
